

Nursery Home learning

Can you take your child a walk around the house? Encourage them to listen to the sounds they can hear around them. What is it? Where do they think



the sound is coming from? Encourage your child to speak in a full sentence, e.g. I can hear the fridge opening. It is in the kitchen.

Using the stairs in your home. Reinforce counting each step in turn with a number starting from 0 upwards. Encourage them to count forwards up to 10. Can they recognise any numbers around them? Watch number blocks on Cbeebies.



While playing with your child. Encourage your child to sort their toys into groups of big/small or by colour or object, e.g. can they place all their teddies together, then all their trains together.




Practise holding a pencil with your child using the correct pencil grip (as below). Then help your child to make marks applying pressure with the pencil.

Encourage your child to draw or make mark. Ask your child to tell you about what they have drawn or written.



Dynamic-Tripod

Teach your child Humpty Dumpty Sat on the Wall.



Talk about your family with your child. Look at photographs of different family members and events that you may have gone to.

Create a family picture together. Encourage your child to talk about the different people.



Time to go into the garden or a large space in the house.

See if you can roll a ball or kick it. Can you hit a target?

Jump up and down.

Practise different ways of moving around the house, walking, jogging, tip toeing.



Story Time

Choose a book with your child. Share a story together and ask your child to join in.

Talk about the pictures and say what is happening.



Experiment with sounds

Collect items from around your house. Tins, cushions, tables. See if you can make different sounds. Make loud sounds and quiet sounds. Try and make sounds with your body.



Make lunch together. Take the time to talk about the different food you have in the house. Encourage your child to try new food and describe what it is like.
